PUTTING CONSTITUENTS FIRST

Since taking office, Congresswoman Strickland and her team worked tirelessly to prioritize the needs of South Sound residents, especially as our community and world grappled with many challenges, including the COVID-19 pandemic.

In 2021, Congresswoman Strickland helped over 880 constituents and returned over \$2.7 million back to residents of Pierce, Thurston, and Mason counties. She was honored to nominate 27 talented applicants to the U.S. Military Service Academies and complete 17 flag requests. In addition, Congresswoman Strickland announced over \$31 million in federal grant funding for organizations across Washington's 10th district.

DELIVERING LEGISLATIVE WINS FOR THE SOUTH SOUND

Congresswoman Strickland got into politics to represent her community and help people. As a lawmaker, she championed her constituents as she skillfully negotiated 23 provisions that passed Congress and 17 provisions that became law.

THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN

Congresswoman Strickland delivered over \$333 million in the American Rescue Plan to keep the South Sound running. This included robust funding for state, local, and tribal governments, rescue checks, and resources to get shots in arms, money in pockets, children in schools, and people in jobs.

- \$240M+ in Child Tax Credit tax cuts for 86,000+ families in WA-10
- \$24,316,103 in Restaurant Grants for small businesses in WA-10
- \$1.8B+ to help K-12 schools in WA reopen safely
- \$302,820,030 in Shuttered Venue Grants for small businesses in WA
- \$213,959,125 for Community Health Centers to help vaccinate communities in WA
- 170,000 Jobs created in WA (as of October)

THE INFRASTRUCTURE LAW

With the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, Congresswoman Strickland secured over \$7 billion in formula funding to support tangible benefits and create good-paying jobs for Washingtonians.

- \$39M to combat climate change
- \$4.7B for highways
- \$100M for broadband
- \$71M for charging stations
- \$1.79B for public transit

- \$605M for bridge repairs
- \$385M for airport development
- \$883M for clean drinking water
- \$18M to combat cyber attacks







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
