Dear Neighbors,

Thank you for the opportunity to serve as your voice in Congress.

This year, our community and the nation faced turbulent times. From attacks on SNAP and Medicaid, to threats on Social Security, to the dismantling of the Department of Education and the Veterans Administration, the list is long. But I never stopped fighting and delivering for you.

Despite this, we have had some wins. We have broken ground on over 200 housing units at Joint Base Lewis-McChord. We have finished projects like Green Cove Culvert and the Spanaway Transit Center. We have completed improvements to the Lakewood International Business District. And we have secured funding for food banks, so our neighbors do not go hungry.

It has been a busy year fighting to deliver for the South Sound. I have worked to protect health care, prioritized our servicemembers and their families, and advocated for the needs of students. Since the start of the year, my office has recovered nearly \$3.5 million for taxpayers and delivered \$780 million in federal grants to support projects at home.

I stand with you and fight for you. In 2026, my priorities include:

- Protecting your SNAP, WIC, and Medicaid
- Supporting servicemembers and families at Joint Base Lewis-McChord
- Investing in transit, broadband and clean-water projects,
- Building more housing,
- Lowering costs,
- Saving health care, and
- Serving you.
