



## Strickland Delivers for the South Sound

### *Secures Fourteen Key Projects*

Congresswoman Marilyn Strickland (WA-10) secured the following provisions in H.R. 1061, the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2024.

#### **Secured funding for fourteen FY24 Community Project Funding (CPF) requests:**

1. Market Fresh Lockers Expansion for District 10  
Recipient: Bonney Lake Food Bank (Good Roots)  
Funding Amount: \$744,000  
Project Description: Address food insecurity by expanding the use of refrigerated smart lockers.
2. College Street Corridor Safety Improvements  
Recipient: City of Lacey  
Funding Amount: \$850,000  
Project Description: Increase pedestrian and vehicle safety on a major north-south artery in the City of Lacey.
3. Shelter Expansion and Site Preparation  
Recipient: City of Tacoma  
Funding Amount: \$850,000  
Project Description: Provide 75 units of warm, safe temporary housing to some of the city's most vulnerable populations.
4. Chambers Bay Access to Opportunity Project  
Recipient: City of University Place  
Funding Amount: \$500,000  
Project Description: Improve traffic flow at the intersection of 64th Street West and Chambers Creek Road while installing ADA-compliant crosswalks. T
5. O'Farrell Senior Co-Housing  
Recipient: Homes First  
Funding Amount: \$500,000  
Project Description: This project will help house senior citizens.

6. PFAS Mitigation Wells Project  
Recipient: Lakewood Water District  
Funding Amount: \$959,752  
Project Description: Drill down to uncontaminated aquifers to partially replace the water supply that has been lost due to PFAS contamination.
7. Campus Project  
Recipient: Living Access Support Alliance  
Funding Amount: \$1,000,000  
Project Description: 25 new affordable 1-, 2-, and 3-bedroom apartments co-located with case management and peer support to prevent homelessness.
8. Sprinker Community Recreation Center Building Renovations  
Recipient: Pierce County  
Funding Amount: \$1,000,000  
Project Description: Improvements to the Sprinker Community Recreation Center.
9. System-Wide Bus Shelters Modernization  
Recipient: Pierce Transit  
Funding Amount: \$2,500,000  
Project Description: Replace vandalized shelters with redesigned shelters that are stronger, less breakable, and reinforced against vandalism.
10. Water Mainline Relocation – Green Cove Creek Culvert  
Recipient: Public Utility District No. 1 of Thurston County  
Funding Amount: \$875,000  
Project Description: Water main relocation to support salmon and stream runs while ensuring the community affected has safe drinking water for their homes.
11. 3900 Boulevard Project  
Recipient: South Puget Sound Habitat for Humanity  
Funding Amount: \$500,000  
Project Description and Explanation: Mixed-income housing with a neighborhood commercial and community benefit element to serve low- and moderate-income families.
12. Pierce County Housing Authority Rehabs  
Recipient: Tacoma/Pierce County Habitat for Humanity  
Funding Amount: \$500,000  
Project Description: Rehabilitate current public housing units and preserve their affordability in perpetuity.
13. Alternative Response Strategies to Improve Public Safety  
Recipient: Tacoma Police Department  
Funding Amount: \$963,000

Project Description: Hire Community Service Officers and Designated Crisis Responders to engage in certain limited law enforcement functions.

14. Lacey Community Hub Development

Recipient: Thurston County Food Bank

Funding Amount: \$1,666,279

Project Description: Developing a Community Hub at Lacey's Food Pantry consists of building additional office spaces for local human service partners.
