1	SEC. 2. PILOT PROCUREMENT PROGRAM FOR MILITARY
2	SPOUSES.
3	(a) Establishment.—The Administrator of the
4	Small Business Administration shall carry out a pilot pro-
5	gram to establish a procurement program for military
6	spouses.
7	(b) AUTHORITY TO RESTRICT COMPETITION.—In ac-
8	cordance with this subsection, a contracting officer may
9	restrict competition for any contract for the procurement
10	of goods or services by the Federal Government to small
11	business concerns owned and controlled by military
12	spouses, if—
13	(1) each of the concerns is not less than 51 per-
14	cent owned by one or more military spouses;
15	(2) the contracting officer has a reasonable ex-
16	pectation that two or more small business concerns
17	owned and controlled by military spouses will submit
18	offers for the contract;
19	(3) in the estimation of the contracting officer,
20	the contract award can be made at a fair and rea-
21	sonable price; and
22	(4) each of the concerns is certified by the Ad-
23	ministrator or a third party certifying entity as a
24	small business concern owned and controlled by mili-
25	tary spouses.

1	(c) Authority for Sole Source Contracts.—A
2	contracting officer may award a sole source contract under
3	this subsection to any small business concern owned and
4	controlled by military spouses described in subsection (b)
5	if—
6	(1) such concern is determined to be a respon-
7	sible contractor with respect to performance of the
8	contract opportunity and the contracting officer does
9	not have a reasonable expectation that 2 or more
10	small business concerns owned and controlled by
11	military spouses will submit offers for the contract;
12	and
13	(2) in the estimation of the contracting officer,
14	the contract award can be made at a fair and rea-
15	sonable price.
16	(d) Governmentwide Goal.—The Administrator
17	shall establish a Governmentwide goal for participation by
18	small business concerns owned and controlled by military
19	spouses at not less than 5 percent of the total value of
20	all prime contract and subcontract awards for each year
21	of the pilot program.
22	(e) Report.—Not later than 1 year after the termi-
23	nation date described in subsection (f), the Administrator
24	shall submit to Congress a report on the pilot program
25	established under this section, including—

1	(1) the number of small business concerns
2	owned and controlled by military spouses that par-
3	ticipated in the pilot program;
4	(2) data on the effectiveness of the pilot pro-
5	gram in encouraging contracting with small business
6	concerns owned and controlled by military spouses;
7	(3) information on whether the goal described
8	in subsection (e) was met;
9	(4) data on oversight of the pilot program; and
10	(5) recommendations for—
11	(A) any improvements to the pilot pro-
12	gram; and
13	(B) whether to make the pilot program
14	permanent.
15	(f) TERMINATION.—The pilot program established
16	under this section shall terminate not later than 5 years
17	after the date of the enactment of this Act.
18	(g) Definitions.—In this section:
19	(1) Administrator.—The term "Adminis-
20	trator" means the Administrator of the Small Busi-
21	ness Administration.
22	(2) Contracting officer.—The term "con-
23	tracting officer" has the meaning given such term in
24	section $27(f)(5)$ of the Office of Federal Procure-
25	ment Policy Act (41 U.S.C. 423(f)(5)).

1	(3) MILITARY SPOUSE.—The term "military
2	spouse' means a current or former spouse of—
3	(A) a veteran; or
4	(B) a member of the Armed Forces (as
5	those terms are defined in section 101 of title
6	10, United States Code).
7	(4) Small business concern owned and
8	CONTROLLED BY MILITARY SPOUSES.—The term
9	"small business concern owned and controlled by
10	military spouses" means a small business concern—
11	(A)(i) not less than 51 percent of which is
12	owned by one or more military spouses or, in
13	the case of any publicly owned business, not
14	less than 51 percent of the stock of which is
15	owned by one or more military spouses; and
16	(ii) the management and daily business op-
17	erations of which are controlled by one or more
18	military spouses; or
19	(B) that is 50 percent owned by a veteran
20	and 50 percent owned by a military spouse of
21	such veteran.
22	(5) Veteran.—The term "veteran" has the
23	meaning given in section 101 of title 38, United
24	States Code.
